Notes: Only alumni with active addresses are shown in the address field. An active address is one that alumni provided themselves or one that was obtained through an address verification service such as the United States Postal Service's National Change of Address (NCOA) database.

Employment information is provided by alumni themselves. Donor status is regardless of amount donated. Minority alumni are African American, American Indian, Hispanic or Asian. Underrepresented minority alumni are African American, American Indian, Hispanic and Southeast Asian (of Cambodian, Laotian, Vietnamese or Hmong descent).

The Wisconsin regional groupings are Workforce Development Areas (WDA) utilized by the Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development. Alumni with Wisconsin addresses are grouped into regions based on their county of residence. Counties are grouped as follows: Southeast (Kenosha, Racine, Walworth), Milwaukee (Milwaukee), W.O.W. (Washington, Ozaukee, Waukesha), Fox Valley (Calumet, Outagamie, Waupaca, Winnebago, Fond du Lac, Green Lake, Waushara), Bay Area (Brown, Door, Florence, Kewaunee, Manitowoc, Marinette, Menominee, Oconto, Shawano, Sheboygan), North Central (Adams, Wood, Portage, Marathon, Lincoln, Langlade, Vilas, Oneida, Forest), Northwest (Ashland, Bayfield, Burnett, Douglas, Iron, Price, Rusk, Sawyer, Taylor, Washburn), West Central (Barron, Chippewa, Clark, Dunn, Eau Claire, Pepin, Pierce, Polk, St. Croix), Western (Buffalo, Crawford, Jackson, Juneau, La Crosse, Monroe, Trempealeau, Vernon), South Central (Columbia, Dane, Dodge, Jefferson, Marquette, Sauk), Southwest (Grant, Green, Iowa, Lafayette, Richland, Rock).

The U.S. regional groupings are those used by the U.S. Census Bureau. Alumni with U.S. addresses are grouped into regions as follows: Northeast (CT, ME, MA, NH, RI, VT, NJ, NY, PA), Midwest (IL, IN, MI, OH, WI, IA, KS, MN, MO, NE, ND, SD), South (DE, DC, FL, GA, MD, NC, SC, VA, WV, AL, KY, MS, TN, AR, LA, OK, TX), West (AZ, CO, ID, MT, NV, NM, UT, WY), Pacific (AK, CA, HI, OR, WA), Military (AE, AA, AP), Territory (AS, FM, MH, GU, MP, PW, PR).
