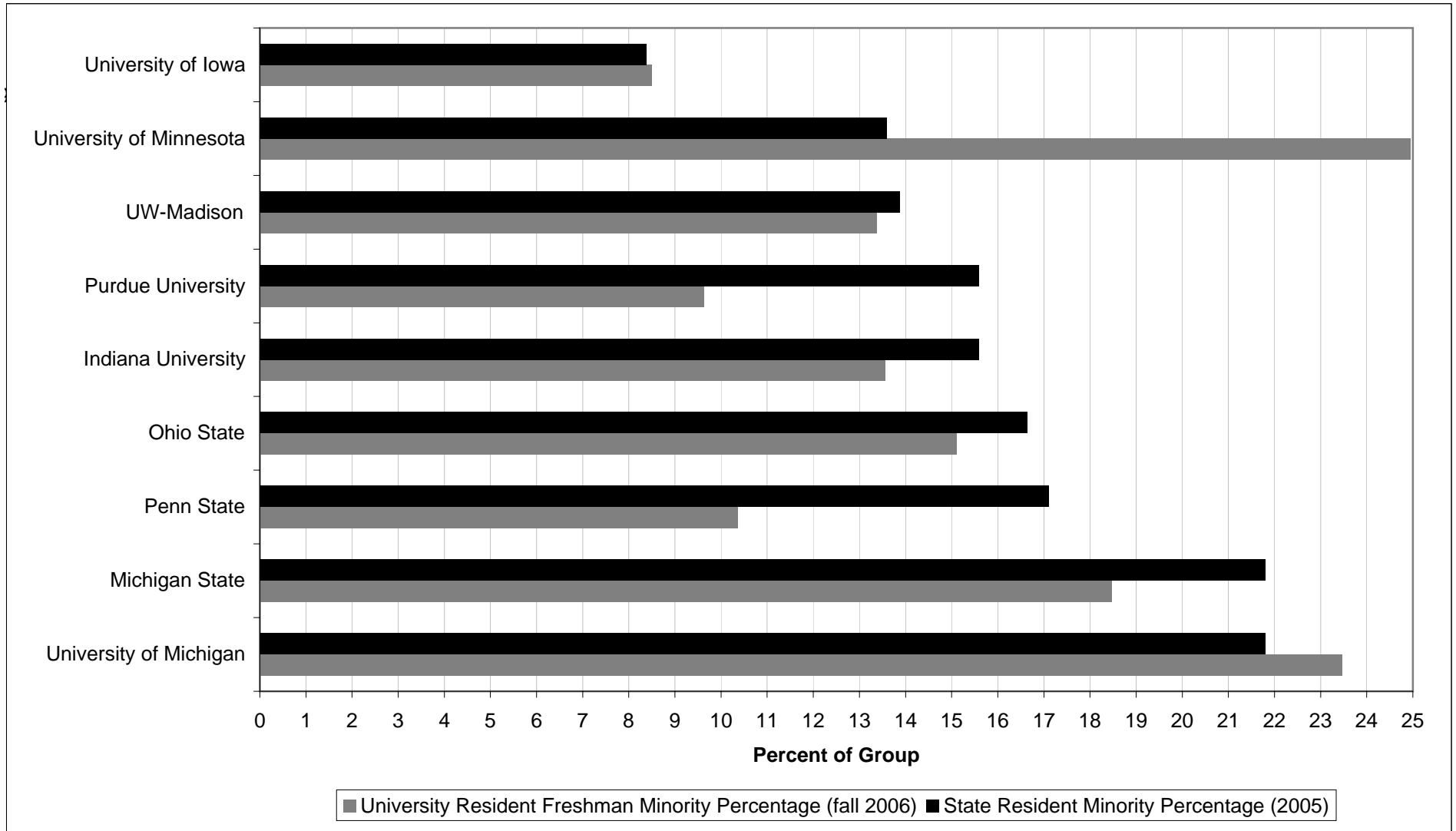
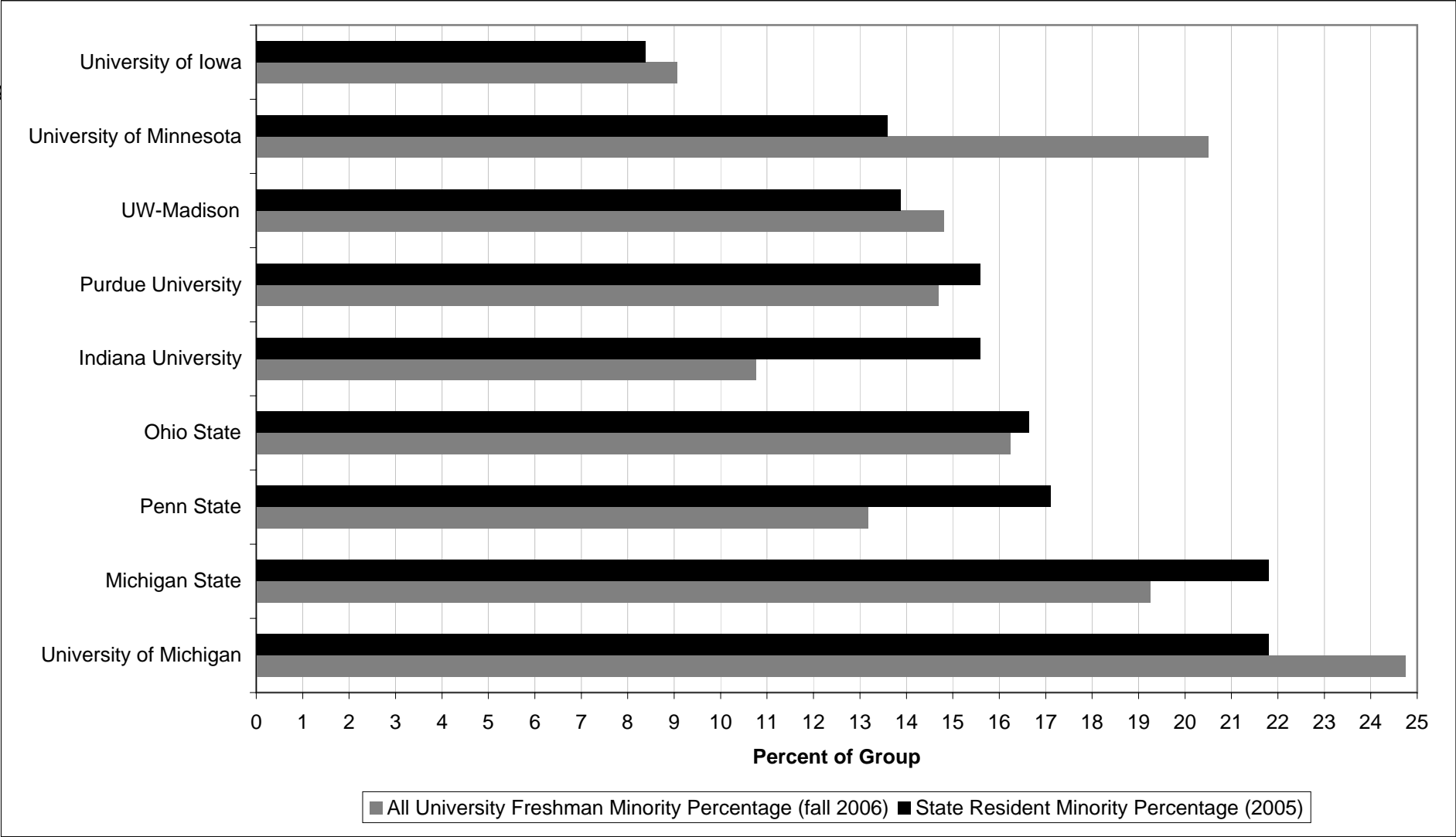


## Comparison of Minority Percentages: Overall State Residents and State-Resident New Freshmen for Big Ten Public Universities



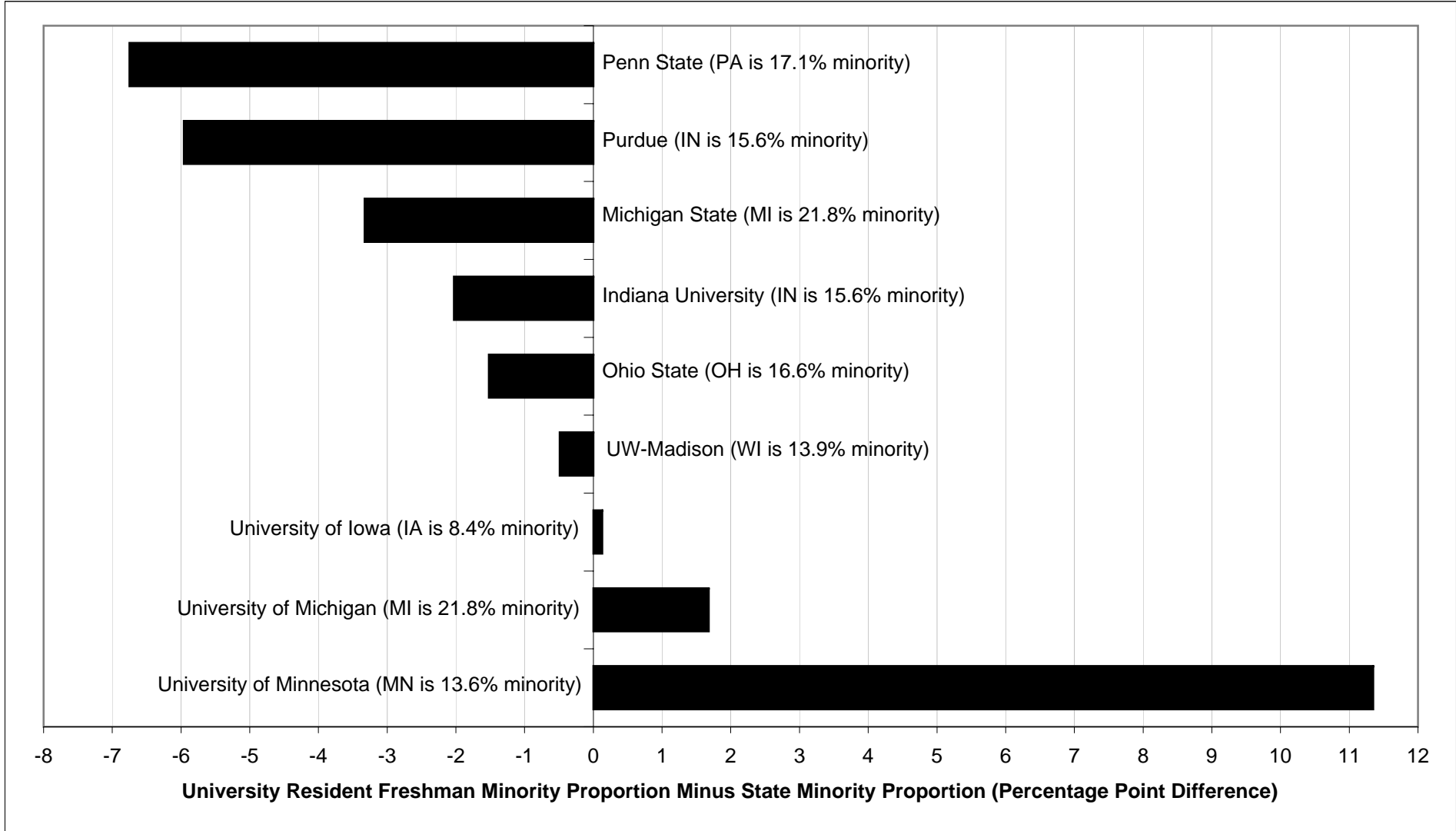

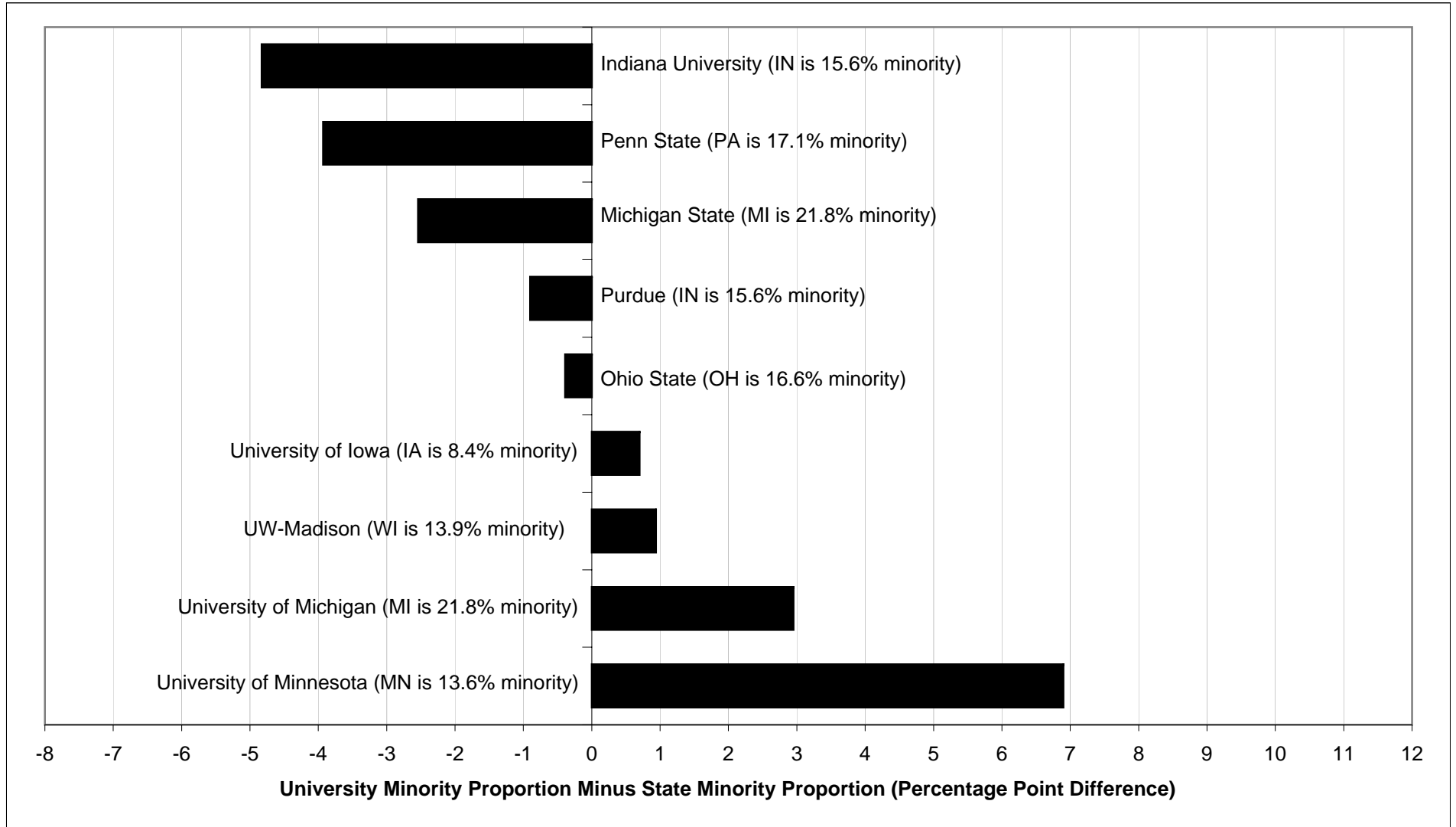
